## What is a Tiny Forest?

A Tiny Forest is a dense and fast-growing woodland made up of 600 native trees, planted in an area the size of a tennis court. It uses the Miyawaki tree planting method, where a community of native trees that include the different layers found in a mature forest, are planted close together. This allows our Tiny Forests to develop rapidly and form a multi-layered forest ecosystem. The Tiny Forest is being created for everyone to use and enjoy.
